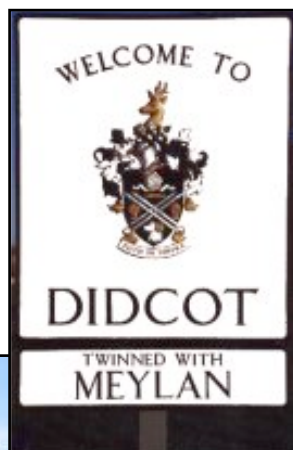

AGM report

The AGM elected a new committee. It also marked the appointment of a new secretary, Geoff Oldham, replacing Sheralyn Hares, whose support of twinning has been highly valued. The AGM heard that recent plant/cake sales at Harwell Feast and a coffee morning raised around £300 for our funds. In addition a grant of £500 has been received from Didcot Town Council.

Business meeting in Meylan

The business meeting to be held in Meylan has been postponed until early next year. Representatives from Planegg and Didcot will travel to Meylan to meet their French counterparts and discuss how to improve the competitiveness of European research and how to facilitate translation from ideas to products. FORTHCOMING VISIT TO PLANEGG

A group of people from Didcot will be visiting Planegg at the end of September. This will be the second such visit and takes the possible twinning of the two towns a step closer. Planegg is already twinned with Meylan. Following a successful meeting of representatives of the Didcot and Planegg twinning associations in Didcot last year, it was decided to open the 2010 visit up to all Didcot and district residents and 9 of them will be making the trip this year. They will fly to Munich airport and be collected by minibus to drive the short distance to Planegg. Their visit will include a chance to see the facilities available to residents of Planegg and to meet the Mayor and some of her councillors.

This civic part of the trip will be followed by an opportunity to see some of the beautiful countryside of southern Bavaria. Staying with host families will also encourage the group to get to understand more about the German (Bavarian) people. Luckily for the non-linguists it is apparent that many Germans speak excellent English and

are very happy to do so. However, any efforts to respond in German are encouraged.

The final feature of the trip is hoped to be a visit to the world famous Oktoberfest, which will be



taking place in Munich at the time of the visit.

HOW YOU CAN GET INVOLVED

To join a trip to the Ashmolean on Friday morning, please be at Didcot station by 0930 or meet us outside the Ashmolean Museum in Oxford between 1030 and 11 am. Entry to the museum is free but you will have to pay your own travel and lunch costs.

On Saturday pm there is a chance to take a guided tour of Basildon House (National Trust), near Reading and in the evening there will be a dinner at Baptist House, Didcot to celebrate the visit. Dinner will cost around £15 per head for the meal including drinks. If you would like to join us for the Basildon Tour (normal entry fees apply) or for dinner on

Saturday, please let Sue Totterdell know before Monday 6th September as we need to know numbers. Remember to say if you would like a vegetarian dinner option.

We hope as many as possible of you will join us for this celebratory evening.
